It has been quiet since our last substantial Update ([January 20](#)). We all know why.

This does not mean that nothing is happening behind closed doors. With the current crisis, however, everything has slowed except in the minds of planners for developments in Santa Cruz County. And even those plans, of both city and county planning departments will have taken a hit, economically, when the dust settles on Shelter in Place. ### **Current Status of Downtown Library Planning**

Recall from [Update #50](#) that the Library Subcommittee requested the same assessment of a library-in-a-garage (aka mixed-use assessment) as was done for a renovation by Jayson Architecture. This process went forward in January and Group 4 Architects was chosen in early February to do that assessment. Group 4's report is expected sometime in May. Maybe. We'll alert you once we know that happens.

Meanwhile, all groups who are engaged in plans for a new library that is dependent on being built in a mixed-use structure have been working at home and keeping one another in their respective loops. We'll most likely have more news to share by mid-May. For now, here are several Action Items:
