### Friends of the Santa Cruz Public Libraries

Apparently someone who receives these updates shared the last with the Executive Director of FSCPL. That's okay. There is nothing in our updates to be hidden from the public. In this case I apparently ruffled feathers with my informal

greetings in Update #15 (3/24) when I mentioned that there is no official Downtown Chapter (amongst the six others found on the Friends of the Santa Cruz Libraries web site). The next day (3/25) I received a personal email from the Executive Director of FSCPL. Although there is no official Downtown Chapter, she wrote "there are 35 volunteers we have who are working only at the Downtown Branch for the Downtown Branch." She said they "would not like to be ignored or misrepresented in the public."

My cordial reply to her was:

*I did check on the [fscpl.org](http://fscpl.org) web site to make sure there is no official Downtown Branch shown. Seeing none, I felt comfortable in writing what I did. As a matter of fact, there are also many volunteers doing good work at the Live Oak Library, and it has no official Chapter.*

*What I wrote -- about no official Downtown Chapter (as shown on the FSCPL web site) -- does not "ignore" or "misrepresent" those volunteers doing such good work at the downtown branch. I hope you will not misrepresent DBTL as ignoring or misrepresenting volunteers.*

### Do All Library Volunteers Support Option B?

The answer to that question is a definite no. In fact, we have been learning directly from volunteers that they are opposed to moving the downtown library to a new parking garage. However, they are hesitant to speak out, for a variety of reasons.

Isn't that a sad state of affairs? They love the library! These sentiments are shared by more than just FSCPL volunteers. Since the Executive Director is likely to see this update I will not name names.

We think it is fair to ask how FSCPL can presume to speak for countless donors over countless years. Have the FSCPL members been polled? Inquiring minds want to know.
